ÉVA VÁRHEGYI is a scientific advisor to Pénzügykutató Zrt., a Doctor (D.Sc.) of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences (MTA), and a Farkas Heller Prize-winning economist. She gained her degree from Budapest University of Economic Sciences in 1975, going on to work as an analyst at the National Bank of Hungary. JÁNOS SZÁZ has been a university professor and lecturer at the Department of Finance of the Budapest University of Economics (now Corvinus University of Budapest) since 1976. From 1983, he has been a part-time associate of the Department of International Financial Policy of MNB. In 1989–1991, he was the first Academic Director of the International Training Center for Bankers. He was on the first Council of the Budapest Stock Exchange (BSE) as a member responsible for training and the development of the examination system, and later, from 1995 to 1996, as Chairman of the BSE. He was a member of the Central Bank Council (now Monetary Council of the MNB) in the second half of the '90s. He authored or co-authored several reference works and coursebooks.
